Neighborhood Task Forces*

- These are important because you can't have community development until you have a community of people working together
- Purpose to encourage neighbors to work with each other and with local government, to create a safer, more attractive and healthier community to live in

“Most Important Issues for Greeley”

- Greeley School – something needs to be done with this, one idea is for the school area to be used as an interpretive museum for/of Butte
- Community Enhancement -- Health/Safety/Beautification/Animal Control/Crime Prevention
- Mediating Impacts from Mining Operations – Air Quality and Noise – any way to assist with home air filters?
- Infrastructure Improvements

Community Enhancement

- Volunteer Patrols – consider how neighbors could patrol and report violations (e.g., barking/loose dogs, crime, decay issues)
- Beautification through landscaping – involve master gardeners, MSU-Extension and residents in beautification projects – one might start with Horse Creek drainage area, have beautification awards (such as Alma Higgins Commemorative Beautification Contest)

Youth Apprenticeship Program

- To develop good work ethics among community youth
- Possible joint venture Anaconda Job Corps, BSB City-County Government
- Potential types of work: landscaping Horse Creek Drainage, landscaping Greeley area streets, assistance with yard work for seniors/others

Continental – Farrell

- View Point Park – “Welcome to Greater Butte” with a trolley stop, information, view of Continental operations
- Part of proposed “Butte-Silver Bow Scenic Drive”
- Landscaping buffers on both sides of the street (not just south and west)
